Fares and tickets

Buses

Most bus fares start at £2.40 for singles and £6.50 for a day ticket.

Ways to buy

- Operators' phone apps
- Contactless or cash on the bus (except metrobus services)
- iPoints at metrobus stops
- For metrobus services you must buy before you board or use Tap On, Tap Off**

*On Bath Bus Company, Faresaver and First Bus services (including metrobus) tap the same card/device when getting on and off the bus for automatic fare calculation.

Rail fares

From £1.60 for singles and £2.10 for returns depending on the stations you travel to/from. Tickets can be bought at ticket offices, machines at stations or online. Find the best fare for your journey at **nationalrail.co.uk** or visit a ticket office.

Cost saver tickets

- Multi-operator bus tickets are available. An AvonRider ticket, which covers the whole region is just £7 and allows unlimited travel for a day on almost all buses in the area. Find out more at travelWEST.info/Rider
- Freedom Travelpass is a flexible ticket for unlimited train and bus travel on participating services. Day tickets start at just £14.50 in this area. travelWEST.info/FreedomTravelpass
- PlusBus is a discount price bus pass that gives you unlimited bus travel in urban areas on top of your train ticket. Find out more at travelWEST.info/PlusBus

Concessionary Travelcard

Disabled and older person's travelcards may be available to you for free travel on buses Monday to Friday (older person's off-peak only) and anytime weekends and public holidays. Find out if you're eligible and apply at **travelWEST.info/ConcessionaryCard**

Community transport is available to all residents across the West of England and is a service particularly well placed to cater for passengers with limited mobility. Operators offer a range of services such as door-to-door transport for essential travel and outings and day trips to places of interest within your area or further afield.

2V	WESTlocal route. Odd Down to Radstock via Timsbury, Paulton and Midsomer Norton. Buses run every two hours on weekdays from around 07:00 to 19:00, with Saturday services also available. The Big Lemon service.		
99	WESTlocal route. Ubley to Paulton via Midsomer Norton, Bishop Sutton and Pensford. Buses run up to 4 journeys a day Monday to Sunday, from around 07:30 to 17:30. The Big Lemon service.		
171	Bath to Wells via Radstock, Midsomer Norton and Paulton. Buses run Monday to Sunday, offering early morning and nighttime journeys only. First Bus service.		
172	Bath to Bristol via A38, Midsomer Norton and Peasedown St John. Buses run every 30 minutes on weekdays from around 07:10 to 23:00, with Saturday services also available. First Bus service.		
173	Bath to Wells via Peasedown St John and Midsomer Norton. Buses run every hour on weekdays from around 06:15 to 20:00, with Saturday services also available. First Bus service.		
174	Bath to Wells via Midsomer Norton and Shepton Mallet. Buses run every hour on weekdays from around 05:00 to 21:45, with weekend services also available. First Bus service.		
184	Midsomer Norton to Frome. Buses run every two hours on weekdays from around 06:40 to 19:40. Libra Travel service.		
376a	Bristol to Wells via A37, Paulton and Midsomer Norton. Buses run Monday to Saturday, offering early morning and nighttime journeys only. First Bus service.		
414/ 424	Midsomer Norton to Frome via Radstock . Up to 9 journeys or weekdays during school term time (some by service 414), 5 journeys outside of term time, with Saturday services also available. FromeBus service.		
522	Bath to Bristol via Midsomer Norton , Paulton and Timsbury . Buses run every 60 minutes on weekdays from around 05:30 to 21:00, with weekend services also available. First Bus service.		

Times are approximate. Frequencies provided for mostly Monday to Friday daytime journeys. Evening and weekend times may vary.

WESTlink

WESTlink is a bookable service without a fixed timetable or route. Ideal for local journeys and to connect with buses and trains, it runs in the majority of the West of England, outside of Bristol and Bath city centres.

From Midsomer Norton, Radstock and surrounding areas it is possible to travel as far as Saltford and Queen Charlton in the north, Freshford in the east, and as far west as Clutton Hill. The University of Bath is also accessible, while connections to shared zones mean places such as RUH, Keynsham, Pensford and Farrington Gurney are possible.





Park & Ride

Park and ride in comfort from convenient sites to Bath and Bristol city centres, with free all-day parking at most locations when using public transport. Keynsham and Saltford travellers can use Brislington Park & Ride for Bristol and Newbridge Park & Ride for Bath. Long Ashton serves Southmead Hospital, while Odd Down serves the Royal United Hospital.

Bristol

Parking is free for public transport users. All sites have a height restriction of 6'10" / 2.1m.

- Brislington Park & Ride: Located on the A4 in Brislington, BS4 5LR. Open Monday to Saturday 05:15 to 22:30 and Sunday & Public Holidays 08:30 to 19:30.
- Long Ashton Park & Ride: Located off the A370 in Long Ashton, BS3 2HB. Open Monday to Saturday 05:00 to 00:00 and Sunday & Public Holidays 07:00 to 20:00.

Operated by Bristol City Council Parking Services. For any site concerns, contact parking.businessteam@bristol.gov.uk.

The sites are locked overnight. Please call Parking Services on 0117 903 8070 if your vehicle is locked in.

Bath

Open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

You must pay for parking if you're not using the bus or if you're parking overnight. Payment must be made via the MiPermit app.

• Odd Down Park & Ride: Located on the A367 south of Bath, BA2 8PA. Height restriction of 7'2" / 2.2m.

Travel to Bristol Airport

Bus service A4 runs every hour from Bath city centre, via Saltford, Keynsham and south Bristol. Bus service A1 runs frequently from Bristol Bus Station, via Bristol Temple Meads and south Bristol.

Accessibility information

Buses are equipped with space for wheelchairs and pushchairs, but they are space permitting and at the discretion of the driver.

There are a limited number of spaces available for wheelchairs on trains, so advance booking is recommended. Pushchairs need to be folded and stored safely.
